# Ugandan Youth Engaged on Africa's Energy Transition



Makerere University hosted a Youth in Energy Conference on Thursday, June 27, 2024. The conference was aimed at engaging young people in discussions around their role in ensuring sustainable development in the oil and gas sector and energy transition.

The conference convened over 200 youth and featured crusading voices that explored potential opportunities presented by the oil and gas sector for ordinary Ugandans, especially youth.

Speaking at the conference, Rahma Nantogo, a 24-year-old Petroleum Geoscience and

Production graduate from Makerere University (MUK) and recent President for the Society of Petroleum Engineers at MUK noted.

**“Uganda is in the hands of biting energy poverty. Our country therefore needs to develop Her resources, ... we still need to contextualize Uganda’s energy situation even as we seek mitigation.”**

Africa Energy Forum Director, NJ Ayuk, applauded the global effort to reduce fossil fuels, but however pointed out the landlocked country’s case is exceptional, and deserving of positive scrutiny.

NJ Ayuk noted that the energy debate should be equitable and just, oil projects have the lowest emissions, no flaring, there is use of solar, silent rigs, and technology audits have been conducted.”

**“ We should proceed on our terms, the population needs more, we cannot conserve poverty, 900 million Africans do not have access to clean cooking technologies. These numbers alone underscore the fact that Africa’s energy reality is no longer about access, but a human right.”**



# Energy Transition Discourse Headlines 2nd Annual CSO Conference



A just, orderly, and equitable energy transition is fundamental for sustainable development in Uganda and globally. Consequently, the Ministry of Energy and Mineral Development (MEMD) and key sector players are implementing the Energy Transition Plan.

The Petroleum Authority of Uganda organized the 2nd Annual CSO Conference on 18th June 2024 at Mestil Hotel in Kampala to deliberate on the plan and how best the private sector, Civil Society Organizations (CSOs), Non Governmental Organizations (NGOs) and oil and gas

companies can contribute to its successful implementation.

Speaking at the event, Irene Bateebe, Permanent Secretary, MEMD said,

**“ The Energy Transition Plan outlines Uganda’s pathway to accelerate efforts towards universal access, energize growing economic activity, and mitigate energy-related greenhouse gas emissions. ”**

Philippe Groueix, General Manager TotalEnergies EP Uganda reiterated the company’s commitment towards energy transition. He said,

**“ As a multi-energy Company, we are aligned with the goal of the Ministry of Energy towards energy transition by developing renewable energy in Uganda. We are therefore committed to supplying Uganda and Ugandans with affordable energy required for development while also reducing emissions which is the “just, orderly and equitable” transition called for by COP28. ”**



## 60 Ugandans Empowered with International Drilling Certification

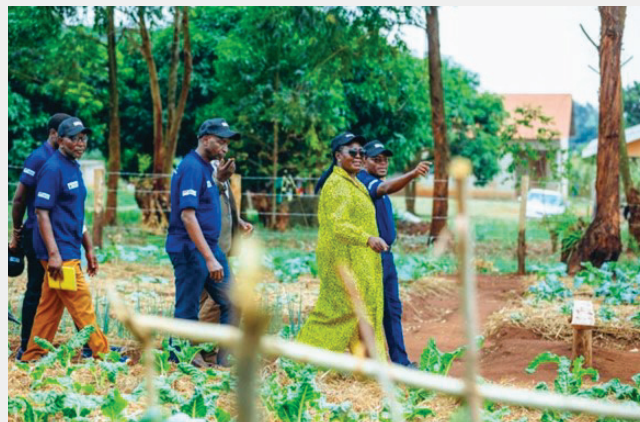


60 Ugandans have received international certification from Solid Rock Life and Business after undertaking The International Association of Drilling Contractors (IADC) Rig Pass Course. The training

The Company raised awareness around environmental protection, which is at the

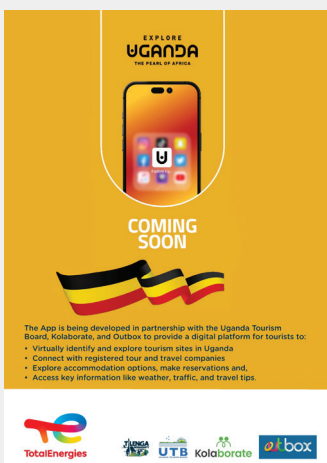
heart of its strategy, operations and aligns with its Sustainability Pillar of 'Caring for the Environment.'

## National Forestry Authority, TotalEnergies Launch Project to Patrol and Conserve Budongo Forest



The National Forestry Authority (NFA) and TotalEnergies EP Uganda have launched the Budongo Central Forest Reserve project to enable and improve joint patrolling of Budongo forest. The project is aimed at preventing encroachment and ensuring the conservation of Budongo Central Forest Reserve. It also aligns with TotalEnergies' sustainability pillar of

'Care for the Environment' and is part of the Company's Biodiversity program.

The one-year project is implemented by Wildlife Conservation Society and will enable the use of SMART technologies to patrol the forest reserve as well as the development and implementation of social safeguards for the

forest's conservation.

Budongo Central Forest Reserve sits on 825 sq km and is Uganda's Largest Central Forest Reserve, as well as the largest mahogany forest in East Africa. It is home to unique flora and fauna wildlife, especially an estimated 600-800 endangered eastern Chimpanzees. The forest is under the management of NFA.

## TotalEnergies Publishes Inaugural Social Report



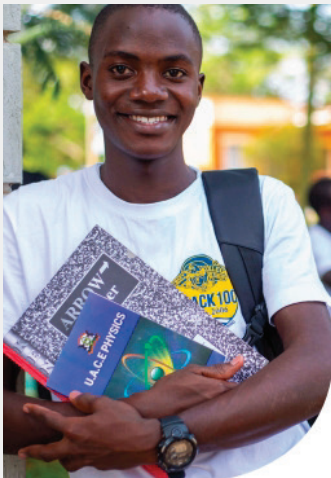

## Enhancing Livelihoods and Food Security Through Improved Agricultural Practices



TotalEnergies EP Uganda has distributed a sweet variety of cassava cuttings known as NAROCASS1 to Project Affected Persons in the Tilenga project area. This initiative was conducted through Agricultural Support Services, a project aimed at providing agricultural services to support PAPs to achieve improved livelihoods, food security, and nutrition. The project is implemented by Living Earth Uganda.

Luka Manano, a PAP, and farmer in Oribo village, Buliisa District has benefited from the initiative and notes that there is

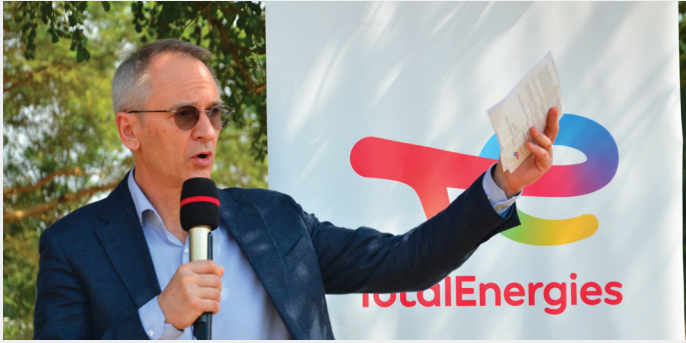
increased yield from the NAROCASS1 Cassava variety, which is sweet and matures within six months unlike the local variety that produces a low yield and matures in two years.

TotalEnergies EP Uganda through the Agricultural Support Services project has distributed eighty-five cassava chippers, maize shellers, with silos and other post-harvest handling equipment to PAPs in the districts of Buliisa, Hoima and Kikuube. This has empowered farmers to engage in the commercial cassava value chain thus improving their livelihoods and food security in the region.

## Extending Clean Water to Tilenga Project Areas



TotalEnergies EP Uganda has rehabilitated and handed over nine boreholes to several villages in Buliisa district. This initiative has been undertaken in partnership with Buliisa District Water Office and is aimed at improving the well being of people living in the Tilenga project areas. It also aligns with the Company's corporate social responsibility pillar of Ensuring People's Wellbeing and the UN Sustainable Development Goal 6 'Access to Clean Water and Sanitation for All'.

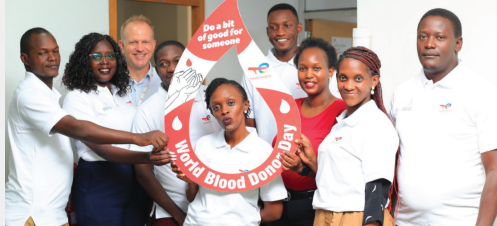

# Projects Updates



## Tilenga Project Updates

### Drilling Operations

- Current Status: Three oil rigs in use (two South of the Nile, one in the North).
- Milestones: Successful drilling of four well pads: Jobi Rii 05 (JBR05), Ngiri 03 (NGR03), Gunya 01 (GNA01), and Ngiri 01 (NGR01).
- **Progress:** 55 wells drilled by June 2024, aiming for 98 wells by year-end. Over 81 km of wells drilled.
- **Rig Moves:** Successful moves from JBR05 to JBR04, NGR03 to NGR01, and GNA01 to GNA04. Drilling ongoing at JBR04 and GNA04.
- **Well Pad Drilling Completion**
  - JBR05: Started in June 2023 – January 2024 (12 wells).
  - NGR03: Started in August 2023 - January 2024 (9 wells).
  - GNA01: Started in November 2023 - April 2024 (14 wells).
- **Efficiency Improvements**
  - Return of Experience (REX) Strategy: Reduced Non-Productive Time (NPT) from 14% to <5%.
  - Drilling Duration: Improved from 22 days to <10 days per well.
- **Enabling Infrastructure**
  - Industrial Area Site Preparation (CFT1): 99.8% complete by June 2024.
  - Road Construction (CFT2): C1, N2, and A1 West roads

complete; A1 East and A4 at 98% and 81% progress, respectively.

- Well Pad Site Preparation (CFT4): Ongoing at multiple sites, with several handed over to drilling operations.

### Engineering, Procurement, Supply, Construction and Commissioning (EPSCC)-Surface Facilities

- Construction Camp at Industrial Area: 80% complete (3,068 beds by June 2024).
- SINOPEC Construction Support Base (CSB) South: Warehouses complete; ongoing equipment installation.
- Concrete and Steel Work: 24% and 20% complete, respectively.

### Carbon Footprint Reduction (CFR) Strategy

- Liquefied Petroleum Gas (LPG) Facility: Production capacity of 40,000 – 80,000 tonnes/year.
- LPG Greenfield Front End Engineering Design (FEED) completed, LPG Engineering, Procurement, and Construction (EPC) contract clarifications ongoing.
- Objective: Recover propane and butane gases for clean cooking gas, reducing indoor pollution and GHG emissions.

### Pipeline Construction

- Progress. 43.42 km of pipeline welded.
- Vegetation Restoration ongoing with 33,540 sqm restored along the Jobi Rii 09 (JBR09) - Jobi Rii 05 (JBR05) pipeline section in MFNP.

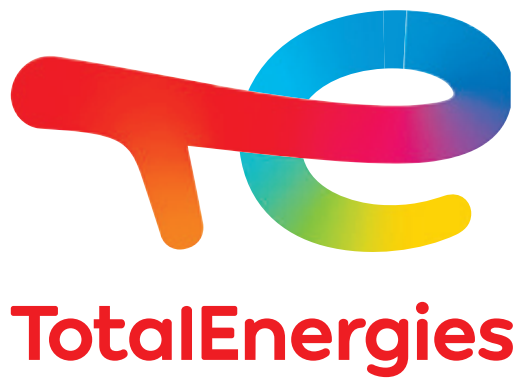
1. How many people are employed on the Tilenga project?  
 9,975 Ugandans (90% of total personnel) have been employed to work on the Tilenga project, 516 (5%) of these are directly employed by TotalEnergies EP Uganda and 9,459 (95%) are employed by the Company's contractors.
2. What is the value (in amounts) of contracts signed by contractors?  
 TotalEnergies EP Uganda has spent over US \$ 715,007,545 on the procurement of locally available goods and services some of which include, human resource, civil engineering and construction services, logistics, camp management and catering services, security, IT, locally available construction and drilling materials, etc.



### Extending Clean Water to Tilenga Project Host Communities – CSR

- Kirama Water System. Provides clean water to approximately 2,000 households in Kirama, Katodio, and Katanga villages, with 6 standpipe service points and a 10,000-litre reservoir.
- Community Boreholes. Developed and rehabilitated 30 boreholes in Buliisa District, extending clean water to over 4,500 households.
- North Kigwera Community Project: Phase II aims to extend piped water supply to more villages within the Tilenga Project area.
- Animal Drinking Troughs: Constructed at Bugungu Secondary School and Ngwendo sub-county, benefiting an estimated 10,000 livestock.
