

I keep control of my vehicle at all times

Staying in control of your vehicle means being sure you can maneuver it as needed to avoid an obstacle or stay on the right track, no matter the circumstances, traffic patterns, or road conditions.

Drivers must always keep control of their vehicle, so as not to endanger their own lives or the lives of other people.

In practice, on the road, you need to:

- **Stay vigilant;**
- **Always be ready and able to maneuver the vehicle as necessary;**
- **Adjust your behavior according to traffic and visibility conditions.**



Before you leave, you need to verify that:

- ✓ Your vehicle is in good operating condition;
- ✓ The vehicle inspection remains valid;
- ✓ The vehicle has safety equipment in proper working order;
- ✓ You have a valid driver's license as per the vehicle type;
- ✓ You have successfully completed the mandatory training.

For proper visibility, you need to ensure that:

- ✓ Your windshield, headlights and windows are clean;
- ✓ You have an unobstructed view of the passenger side, dashboard, and out the rear window.
- ✓ The rearview mirrors are properly angled to minimize blind spots;
- ✓ You use your turn signals to signal turns and lane changes.



I keep a safe distance

**Braking distance
is multiplied
by 2**
on a wet road.

To keep a safe distance from the vehicle in front of you, you need to:

- ✓ Keep at least two seconds of distance for light vehicles;
- ✓ Keep at least three seconds of distance for heavy vehicles;
- ✓ Put your foot on the brake pedal when approaching a hazardous area so you can brake quickly.

In hazardous driving conditions, you need to:

- ✓ Be more vigilant;
- ✓ Reduce your speed;
- ✓ Increase the safe distance between you and the vehicle ahead of you;
- ✓ Take a break at least once every two hours of driving.

High-risk situations on the road include:



Poor road surface condition.



Heavy traffic or activity alongside the road.



Poor visibility (fog, rain, snow, etc.).



Inappropriate behavior by other drivers on the road.


